What will the course involve?

The BTEC Level 3 in Business at Carmel College gives every learner the opportunity to develop a real understanding of what is involved, both theoretically and practically, in becoming an effective business professional. We try to give you a greater involvement with businesses, so more trips to businesses, more research of real businesses, a work placement in the second year and a greater development of the personal skills you will need to succeed in the business world.

You have the opportunity to study the course as a single qualification which is the equivalent to 1 A Level (Extended Certificate) or as a double award qualification which is the equivalent to 2 A Levels (Diploma).

What will I study?

Depending upon the route you choose, you will complete either 4 units on the BTEC Extended Certificate or 8 units on the BTEC Diploma over the course of two years, providing you with the equivalent to 1 or 2 A Levels. There are a certain number of mandatory units, whilst the optional units are chosen to provide you with the best opportunity to achieve at your highest level. You will cover topics such as marketing, personal and business finance, event management, international business and principles of management.

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed in a number of different and engaging ways and the assessment methods vary to include communications used in the modern day business world. This could be a report, presentation, debate or Prezi. You will also be involved practically in activities such as market research, team work and project management. Overall approximately 75% of the course is assessed by coursework and approximately 25% by external exam.

Where does the course lead?

A BTEC Level 3 can lead to a similar course at university, an apprenticeship, employment in a small or large organisation or even the opportunity to run your own business. What is important to know is that there is a very wide range of progression opportunities which will be available to you when you complete the course. Areas of study, an apprenticeship or employment could include:

Business Studies • Business Management • Project or Event Management • Retail, Merchandising and Sales • Law • Marketing and Advertising • Finance and Accounting • Personnel Development • Administration • Human Resources

Of course, a BTEC can be built into a programme that also includes A Level courses, and you could always go down routes related to that.

What BTEC Business Enrichment can I look forward to?

Our students have really benefitted from working closely with outside organisations. This often involves visiting these organisations which have included Liverpool Maritime Museum, the Liverpool One Complex, Alton Towers and the Warner Brothers Studio tour. The students listened to professionals talk about the customer service provided by the organisations and were given information about the marketing of the attractions. Students have also had fun learning about Darkstar in St Helens. The trip included a marketing talk as well as a game of laser quest. Trips abroad are also offered. Every year, students have the opportunity to participate in a residential trip, this year to Paris. In previous years, trips have been to New York, Madrid and Barcelona.

Guest speakers are also invited into college. These have included young entrepreneur and Director, Mark Stanbury, who shared the secret of his success with the students, as well as the Marketing Manager from Pilkington Glass, Anne Quayle. The college Finance Director and Marketing Manager have also been into class to talk about their job roles.

BTEC Business Further Opportunities

The support and guidance you receive studying BTEC Business does not stop when the lesson finishes. Other opportunities include:

We have a dedicated **Work Experience Co-ordinator** who will speak to you and support you in finding a work experience placement for the second year of your BTEC course. This year the placements have been a fantastic success, with many students being offered further opportunities after the placement has ended. The types of excellent placements that you could be involved with include: solicitors, schools, accountancies, finance departments in large corporate companies, quantity surveying, civil engineering, media design companies, dentists and so much more! This is a remarkable opportunity to add something onto your CV which will make you stand out as a future recruit.

Our students also thoroughly enjoyed our BTEC Business Careers Week and participated in workshops with KPMG and activities with organisations such as Goldman Sachs. This was further supported by a range of interesting apprenticeship talks and visits from universities, such as the University of Liverpool. In addition, our Careers Advice section on CONNECT has a wealth of information about apprenticeships, taking a Gap year and working abroad, alongside tips on interview techniques and other possible career prospects.

This year two of our highest achieving BTEC Business students will be travelling down to London to take part in **The Leadership Symposium** on 29th November 2016. It will be presented by Jeremy Thompson, "The Voice" of Sky News. This exciting symposium will compare and contrast Management in Business and Sport as well as celebrate all that is great about the Food and Drink industry. This year, Great Britain's double Olympic gold medallist, Dame Kelly Holmes will be present on the day. Attendance at the symposium is a reward for all their hard work and commitment on the BTEC course and will look amazing on our students' CVs.

How does BTEC Business differ from A Level Business Studies?

The BTEC Business course is predominantly coursework based, therefore you really must enjoy the practical side of coursework. You will sit an external exam worth approximately 25% of your final grade as well as a controlled assignment. BTEC Business is worth the same amount of UCAS points as any other A Level including Business Studies. BTECs are viewed very favourably within the workplace and at university, including the prestigious Russell Group of universities. BTEC Business is endorsed by many global companies and recognised by leading business institutions.

What A Levels complement BTEC Business?

There are no forbidden combinations of subjects so we encourage you to choose subjects that you will achieve in and are motivated to study. Subjects that are popular to study alongside BTEC Business include ICT, Maths, Law, Economics and Languages.

Can I take BTEC Business as well as Economics?

Economics and Business go very well together. Both subjects cover very different topics, so there is little in the way of duplication. However, many of our students find it interesting to study the role of businesses and the economy together.

What support will I receive?

During your time at Carmel, you will receive enormous amounts of support from a variety of different areas. Within the BTEC Business department you will find staff who care about your progression at Carmel and ensure that you enjoy college and succeed during your time with us. All of the department staff are willing to give you extra help and time to ensure you understand the subject and to provide you with support and advice. Our door is always open and you will find staff working with students at break, lunchtimes and after college to help them succeed.
