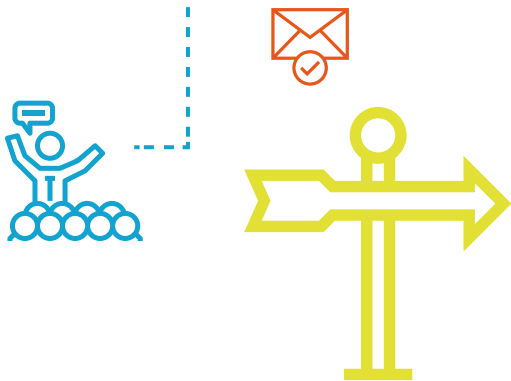

- Functional Skills Maths and English

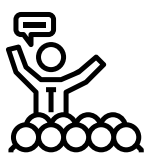

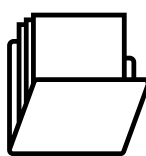

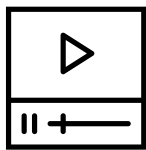
